

Student Health

Immunization Requirements

All students must be in compliance with NYS immunization standards in order to attend school. A child will not be allowed to attend school without proper verification of the immunizations.

The New York State Department of Health and the New York State Education Department have updated immunization requirements for children entering/enrolled in public schools. Effective September 2016, the following immunization schedule must be followed:

- 3-4 doses Polio (IPV/OPV) *Note: Children who receive all 3 polio doses before age 4 will require an
 additional 4th dose in order to have 4 valid doses; that is, a booster dose is required after age 4.
- 2 doses MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)
- 2 doses Varicella (chickenpox)
- 4-5 doses DTap, DPT or Tdap (Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis) *Note: 4 doses are adequate if 1 dose was given after age 4, otherwise a 5th booster vaccine is required. A booster dose is required after age 4.
- 1 dose Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis) *Note: Required only for students enrolling grades 6-8 who
 have not previously received a Tdap at 7 years of age or older.
- 3 doses Hepatitis B *Note: A total of 4 doses of hepatitis B vaccine may be necessary when a combination vaccine containing hepatitis B is administered after the birth dose resulting in an inadequate interval between doses.
- Meningococcal vaccine is required for all students entering the 7th grade.

Menands will require proof of compliance before your child may enter school. Adequate proof is a certificate or record from the physician's office or health care clinic. Please contact your child's physician or the school nurse at your child's school with questions.

Health Examination

New York State law requires a health examination (physical) for all students entering the school district for the first time and when entering into Pre K, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th and 7th grade. We encourage this to be done by your child's physician, as he/she can offer a more complete examination through his/her knowledge of your family. In the situation a child does not have access to a physical/physician they have the opportunity to have it done by our school physician. If a physical is done by our school physician you will be notified of any abnormal findings. The exam must be completed on the form approved by New York State. If your child had a physical done over the summer (or anytime during the year), please have a copy faxed to the school and keep a copy for your records. Your physician may fax the

report to us at the following number: 518-465-4572

A copy of the health examination must be provided to the school within 30 days from when your child first starts at the school, and when your child starts Pre K, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th and 7th grade. If a copy is not given to the school within 30 days, the school will contact you.

Dental Certificates

A dental certificate which states your child has been seen by a dentist or dental hygienist is also asked for at the same time.

Special Health Needs

So that we may provide the best care for your child, please inform us of the following:

- Food allergy.
- Bee sting allergy.
- · Allergy to any other medications.
- Difficulty with vision, hearing or speech.
- Need for medication during the school day.
- Any medical diagnosis for which your child may take medication at home.
- Any head injury or concussion that occurs.

Medication in School

In order to have medication administered to your child while in school you MUST have the following:

- A physician's order completed by their doctor.
- A new request must be provided annually.
- Parent permission completed on the physician's order form.
- An adult MUST bring the medication into school.
- Medications are in their original container that clearly states the date, name and address of the student and physician, the dosage and the frequency. All inhalers must have a labeled box.
- An adult must pick up any leftover medication or it will be discarded on the last day of the school year.

The above refers to ALL medications including over-the-counter medications that are used on an "as needed" basis.

Accidents and Injuries at School

If an accident occurs in school, the parent/guardian will be notified. The student will be treated with appropriate first aid measures until the parental authority can authorize further treatment.

Residency/Registration

General registration is open all year. Pre-K registration runs from March through our budget vote on the third Tuesday in May.

To enroll you must reside in the Menands Union Free School District. Solely owning property or a home does not constitute residency. Proof of residency is required before a student may be registered. All registration information including acceptable proof of residency documentation can be found at https://www. menands.org/about-us/student-registration/ Please be sure your name and address are on all documents.

This documentation will be retained in the student's file along with other required documents. Your child(ren) will not be admitted to the district until these forms have been received and verified.

The Menands School District will make a residency determination based upon the material provided by the parent(s)/guardian(s).

If you're living in the Menands District and are registering your child at a high school, private school or charter school you must first register them at Menands. Once that is complete, you may then register them at the school of your choice.

Proof of Age

In order to determine a student's age, a certified transcript of a birth certificate or record of baptism (including a certified transcript of a foreign birth certificate or record of baptism) is required. If such documents are not available, a passport would be accepted. Once you have all the required documentation, you're ready to register your child.

Annual Notifications

Asbestos Management Plan

On June 15, 2022, Menands Union Free School District performed the triennial inspection and submitted the district's Asbestos Management Plan to the New York State Education Department. The requirements of the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) call for public school districts and nonprofit schools to inspect their buildings for asbestos-containing building material, to prepare management plans and to take action to prevent or reduce asbestos hazards. In accordance with federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to be re-inspected for all known or assumed asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM) in all facilities which are owned, leased, or otherwise used as a school building every three years.

Pesticide Notification

Under state law, the Menands Union Free School District is required to notify families that pesticide products may be used in school buildings throughout the year. Parents, guardians, and staff may request 48-hour advance written notification, including the date and place where the pesticide will be used, the name of the pesticide and its EPA registration number and who to contact for more information. Child Abuse Hotline

If you believe a child is being abused or maltreated, you can help by making a call to the New York State Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment, otherwise known as the Child Abuse Hotline. The hotline is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year. If you suspect a child is in immediate danger, call 911.

Child Find

Under federal and state law, educational agencies are required to identify, locate and evaluate all students who may have a disability that affects their ability to learn. The law requires Local Educational Authorities (LEAs) to provide special education services to students with learning-related disabilities even if they are advancing from grade to grade.

How is the school budget developed?

Each year, the Menand's School Board works with the district leaders to create a school budget. Past and current budget information is posted on the district's website: www.menands.org

How can the community participate in the budget process?

The district holds several budget workshops throughout the budget process beginning in February as an opportunity for community members to stay informed on the current matters and issues to be voted on. The community and public are welcome to attend all board meetings throughout the budget process as well as the entire school year.

What does the public vote on?

The Board of Education adopts a proposed spending plan in mid-April. A newsletter describing budget highlights along with the required budget report card is then printed and mailed to all district homes in early May. All required budget material is also available in the District Offices, the Principal's Office and the Menands Public Library.

A public vote on the proposed budget, by law, is held on the third Tuesday in May, which this school year is May 20, 2025.

In addition to the district newsletter, Menands community members can access information about the proposed school budget, board candidates, library trustees, and all other propositions, if applicable, through the district website Board of Education meetings and the local media.

When and where is the vote?

Polls are open on Tuesday, May 20 from 12 p.m. - 8 p.m. at the Menands School District Office, located at 19 Wards Lane, Menands, NY 12204.

VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

Voters must be 18 years old, United States citizens, and have resided in the district for at least 30 days prior to the vote. You do not need to be pre-registered in order to vote, but personal identification may be requested at the polls.

Absentee ballots are issued, upon request, to residents of the school district who will be out of town or unable to vote in person due to illness or disability. To vote via absentee ballot, district residents must first complete and sign an absentee ballot application. District residents may also request a mail in ballot via an application. Both are available at elections.ny.gov.

A completed application must be received by the district clerk at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter or the day before the election if the ballot is to be picked up at the District Office. The ballot itself must be returned to the District Clerk no later than 5 p.m. on the day of the election.
